The City of Phoenix Planning and Development Department (PDD) will be partnering with the American Institute of Architects, Arizona (AIA) on a design competition that will inspire innovative ideas and solutions for Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs). One of the primary goals is to curate a collection of pre-approved ADU model plans that will make this housing type more accessible and affordable.

The purpose of the design competition is to raise visibility around the benefits of ADUs as one way to relieve a countywide housing shortage and to encourage housing variety/affordability. The design competition also aims to inspire the public with tangible examples of freestanding ADUs they could visualize in their neighborhoods.
