Now Taking Off at Sky Harbor

Long waits in TSA security checkpoint lines can now be a thing of the past. Sky Harbor's free virtual reservation pilot program, PHX RESERVE, allows passengers to schedule a specific time to get in the TSA Security Checkpoint line.

Reservations can be made up to three days before a passenger's flight and can be scheduled for between one and four hours before flight departure.

The service is currently available from 4 a.m. to 3 p.m. in Terminal 3, Level 2 Security Checkpoint area and from 5:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. in Terminal 4, Level 3 Security Checkpoint D. SkyHarbor.com/PHXReserve.
