Every year, the City uses water usage from January, February, and March to calculate the monthly sewer charges on your City Services Bill. Phoenix Water uses those three months to calculate the sewer charges because those are typically the lowest water use months. ### Phoenix is Prepared for Shortage Caused by Drought

Central Arizona is experiencing the first-ever Tier 1 Shortage on the Colorado River in 2022. While a Tier 1 Shortage does not currently affect Phoenix's water supplies, additional shortage tiers are expected to impact Phoenix's Colorado River supplies in the next several years. The City of Phoenix will continue to provide safe, clean, and reliable water to our



customers without interruption. The City has developed a robust water resource portfolio over many decades and will continue to take proactive actions to prepare for even deeper shortages on the Colorado River. However, Phoenix needs the partnership of its residents and business owners to be more water smart and conserve water. #### **Moving Water Where it's Needed**

The Drought Pipeline Project (DPP) will ensure all residents and businesses in Phoenix have access to water from the Salt and Verde rivers as the Colorado River continues to run low. As part of this project, the City is updating and replacing existing infrastructure and installing new infrastructure needed to serve all residential and commercial customers.

## No Fats, Oils, or Grease in Drain!

Customers can avoid damaging their pipes by not pouring leftover fats, oils, and grease (FOG) from cooking down the drain. Tips to protect:

- **Store It:** Once cooled, use a coffee filter, cheesecloth, or strainer to siphon grease into a container.
- **Scrape It:** Scrape all scraps from dishes into the trash before washing.
- **Trash It:** Only throw away small amounts in sealable containers. Grease can damage the City's collection trucks and disposal facilities.

#### The Cost of Water

When Phoenix Water customers look over their monthly bills, they sometimes don't realize what they get for their money. Just like the weather in the Arizona desert, what we get depends upon the time of year.

Most Phoenix residential customers have a 5/8-inch water meter, and with the current water rates, there is a service charge of \$4.64 for this size meter. But, with that service charge, customers receive six (6) units of water from October through May and ten (10) units from June through September. One unit is equal to 748 gallons.


If customers go beyond the units provided, the City will apply a volume charge. Customers who regularly conserve water by not using more than the allotted units have a lower bill. Customers who go over their allotted units, will incur volume charges that vary depending on the season. Here is a breakdown of the unit charges for each season for Phoenix customers.

Low Season (Dec., Jan., Feb., March) \$3.49
Medium Season (April, May, Oct., Nov.) \$4.07
High Season (June, July, Aug., Sept.) \$4.47

#### **How Much Water do You Use?**

Showers, dishwashing, laundry, toilet flushes, landscaping, and pools contribute to water usage in your home. The water calculator at **phoenix.gov/watercloud** helps customers better understand their water usage. Be aware the calculator produces an estimate, and actual usage may vary.
