Election Day 2022 is Coming Soon



Registered Phoenix voters in Districts 2, 4, 6, and 8 will elect council members on election day, Tuesday, Nov. 8, 2022. Here is some additional information:

When is the Voter Registration Deadline? Tuesday, Oct. 11, 2022.

When is Early Voting by Mail? Early ballots will be mailed on Oct. 12. Voters not on the Active Early Voting List (AEVL) can request an early ballot by mail by visiting Request.Maricopa.Vote or calling 602-506-1511 no later than Oct. 28. Track your ballot at BeBallotReady.Vote.

When is In-person Voting? Oct. 12 through Nov. 4. To find a voting location near you visit: Locations.Maricopa.Vote. Accessible voting devices will be available at these sites. You do not have to be on the AEVL to vote early in person. All registered voters can vote in person – just bring your identification!

GOPHX 2023 GO Bond Program

WHAT IS THE GO BOND PROGRAM?

On June 7, the Mayor and City Council approved moving forward with a proposed General Obligation (GO) Bond program of \$500 million. It pays for major capital improvements that serve a public purpose, such as renovating and building new parks and libraries, investing in the Housing Phoenix Plan, the Climate Action Plan, and more.



WHAT TO EXPECT AT MEETINGS?



Committee meetings are available to the public and community input is highly encouraged to help decide which important City projects will be recommended to City Council. Presentations and discussions will be prominent in GO Bond Subcommittee meetings. City department representatives will present projects to members before public comment and discussion amongst the subcommittee. To attend a meeting, visit Phoenix.gov/Bond.

WHAT TYPES OF PROJECTS WILL BE PROPOSED?

The focus of this GO Bond Program is rehabilitation and rebuilding. The City hopes to fix aging infrastructure, expand and renovate City buildings and address critical structural needs. Projects were identified through a capital needs study.

- Replace and repair aging infrastructure
Construct public safety buildings
Build parks and splash pads
Build and expand community cultural centers


