Runoff Election: Important Dates



On Tuesday, March 14, 2023, Phoenix will conduct a Runoff Election in which Districts 6 and 8 voters will elect a council member.

Important dates:

- Feb. 15: Early ballots mailed
- March 3: Deadline to request an early ballot by mail
- Feb. 15-March 10: In-person early voting available 8 a.m.-5 p.m. on 15th floor of Phoenix City Hall (200 W. Washington St.)
- March 11: Voting Centers open 10 a.m.-4 p.m.
- March 13: Voting Centers open 9 a.m.-6 p.m.
- March 14: Voting Centers open 6 a.m.-7 p.m.

Voting devices allowing those with disabilities to vote independently will be at all locations. In-person voters must present ID. Visit Phoenix.gov/ Elections to request a ballot, track ballot status, or find a voting center location.

Sky Harbor Opens PHX Sky Train



Just in time for the Super Bowl, the City of Phoenix opened the final stage of the PHX Sky Train®. The 2.5 mile extension connects the terminals with the Rental Car Center and adds two new stations – the Rental Car Center Station and the 24th Street Station. Trains arrive and depart every three to five minutes 24 hours a day.

The new 24th Street Station provides a convenient option for West Valley and downtown Phoenix travelers. Just behind the station, travelers will find a new 1,600 space parking area. Learn more: **SkyHarbor.com/PHXSkyTrain**.

Winter Landscaping & Watering Tips



Shorter days and cooler weather mean outdoor plants and landscaping need less frequent watering. Overwatering can be harmful to many desert plants. Check sprinklers and irrigation timers regularly to water properly for the season, and turn the irrigation off when it rains. Also, if you want to change your home's landscaping this winter, try low-water-use plants and place grass only where needed.

Tax Season is Coming: File for Free

Did you know it costs about \$300 to get your taxes done? There are three ways you can file for FREE this tax season by using the City's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program.



- 1. **Do It Yourself:** Individuals or families making less than \$73,000/year can prepare tax returns using our free online software and get help from a VITA tax volunteer.
- 2. In-Person Assistance: Individuals and families making less than \$58,000/year can make an appointment to work with an IRS-certified tax preparer to get returns filed.
- 3. MyFreeTaxes.com: Complete your own taxes for free online at home using a self-paced, step-by-step guide to file your returns. IRS-certified tax volunteers are available to help through online chat.


