After pre-paying for your parking, be prepared to show your employee badge and parking access ticket upon entry to the garage. The discounted rate is only valid for pre-purchase with the link in this newsletter. This rate will not be available at the gate.

The Equal Opportunity Department, Housing Department, and the Southwest Fair Housing Council, are celebrating National Fair Housing Month. The Fair Housing Act prohibits discrimination in the sale, rental, financing, and other housing-related transactions based on race, color, religion, sex (including sexual orientation, gender identity or expression), national origin, disability, and familial status.



The City of Phoenix also prohibits discrimination due to an applicant's source of income -- for example, Section 8 Housing Choice Vouchers, Social
