



Electrician - Aviation Department

Pay Range: \$28.86 to \$40.61 per hour Hiring Range: \$28.86 to \$36.84 per hour

(Pay range is the entire compensation range for the position classification. Hiring range is an estimate of where you can receive an offer.)

The Aviation Department is seeking a motivated electrician. This position performs work in the maintenance, construction, installation, alteration/modification, and repair of electrical systems such as airfield series lighting, medium voltage gear, and preventive maintenance on equipment and fixtures. Work is performed in accordance with standard practices of the electrical trade for primarily commercial and industrial applications. Certain assignments may include electronics metering and instrumentation and working with various voltages. Assignments are received verbally and electronically through the work order process.

DID YOU KNOW

City of Phoenix employees can apply for any opening where they meet the position's minimum qualifications, regardless of the pay grade. Taking a job in the same pay grade as your current job is called a **lateral transfer**. What does that mean? Lateral transfers are not automatically eligible for a pay increase. This means starting in the new job's salary grade at your current rate and then advancing through the steps in the new job's pay grade. The new position can open opportunities where you can continue to grow professionally. Explore City job descriptions and pay grades here.

To determine if the job would be considered a lateral transfer, look at the last two numbers of the current and potential new jobs' pay grades. If they are the same, then this would be a lateral move. **NOTE**: this does not automatically apply to middle manager or executive level pay grades.
