### PAID PARENTAL LEAVE

Are you growing your family? If so, you may qualify for up to 480 hours of Paid Parental Leave (PPL).

Who is eligible for this program: Employees must have a had a qualifying event within the last 12 months *and* meet all the program requirements below:

### **Qualifying Events**

- Has given birth to a child
- Be a spouse or partner of someone who has given birth to a child
- Has adopted a child
- Received placement of a foster child



### **Program Requirements**

- Have been employed with the City of Phoenix for at least 12 months prior to the requested date of leave
- ◆ Have worked at least 1,250 hours during the 12 months preceding the date the leave would begin

How to get started: At least 30 days prior to birth or adoption / foster care placement, contact FMLASource (the City's FMLA and PPL vendor) to verify your eligibility for the program and begin the application process. We all know how great a fireplace can be on cool winter nights, especially during the holidays. However, during the winter Maricopa County has a problem with smoke. If the issue is not corrected and the smoke levels remain near the federal health standards, Maricopa County could face burdensome federal regulations, possible fines, and a substantial health risk for our residents. Please "Burn Cleaner, Burn Better," and on No Burn Days, don't burn wood.

If possible, use a gas or electric fireplace, convert your wood-burning fireplace to natural gas, or retrofit your fireplace with an air pollution reduction device. 
### **VACATION CARRYOVER**


