Featured Job of the Week

The Utility Specialty Technician works under general supervision in an independent role performing time sensitive, specialized work within the water distribution or wastewater collection system. This position uses mobile devices with an asset management system to receive work orders and document work performed. Duties include working in all the following specialty operations: valve assessments and isolations, flow tests, auto flushers, hydrant repair, large transmission main/valve operation, large wet taps, leak detection, water compliance, and backhoe operations.

In Blue Stake Operations, this position works independently to locate/mark sewer, water, and reclaimed water lines for contractors or other utilities in accordance with Arizona Blue stake laws; ensures information on job orders is accurate by comparing between the City's QS mapping system and the GIS system to ensure accurate location; and uses a laptop computer to update job order status and write reports on incorrect or missing assets.


