2026 Changes for Future Retirees

COPERS' policy requires the Board to review actuarial factors every five years and make necessary changes to match COPERS' specific experience and the life expectancy of its members. These factors determine the percentage of the Straight Life pension a retiree would receive if another pension option is elected, e.g. Option A – 100% Joint and Survivor, Option B – 50% Joint and Survivor. The percentage is based on the age of the retiree and the age of the retiree's spouse/survivor at retirement.

New factors will go into effect on January 1, 2026, for anyone who retires that day or later.

Based on a review of the data, **some individuals may see a slight increase or decrease** in their estimated pension amount. If you requested a pension estimate from the Retirement Office or ran one yourself in eCHRIS (Tier 1 only) or through MemberDirect prior to December 12, 2025; it is strongly recommended that you contact the Retirement Office to request a new estimate before making any retirement decisions.
