They were acknowledged at the City Manager's Quarterly Service Awards event for their hard work, commitment, and contributions towards *Building the Phoenix of Tomorrow*.




Phoenix's Excellence on Display

Water Services Project Coordinator

The City of Phoenix Water Services
Department, one of the nation's largest
potable water utilities, treats and
delivers safe, reliable drinking water to
1.5 million customers across
approximately 540 square miles.
Phoenix Water Services also manages
the sewer collection system and treats
wastewater for 2.5 million residents in
metropolitan Phoenix.

The Water Services Project Coordinator is assigned to the Environmental & Safety Division (ESD) of the City of Phoenix Water Services Department (WSD). The position will report to the Environmental Programs Manager for the ESD Compliance Section and has the responsibility to supervise the Air Quality and Hazardous Materials Management Section.

The position oversees environmental regulatory compliance activities of the WSD operations related to the Clean Air Act (CAA), Clean Water Act (CWA), Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA), and Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA).

DID YOU KNOW

The City of Phoenix Employee Development Fund (EDF) Program helps employees to further their education, attend job-related seminars/workshops, and obtain job-related licenses or certifications. The EDF is for all employees in a full-time benefit-eligible position except Middle Managers and Executives (the Management Development Fund is governed by Administrative Regulation 2.281 through the Finance Department).
