OFFICER KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY

Services are still being planned for Officer Zane Coolidge, the Phoenix Police Officer who was shot and killed in the line of duty last week.

"Officer Coolidge's family is dealing with unimaginable grief. We will do everything we can to help them through their darkest hours, and we pledge that they will always be a part of the Phoenix Police Family. I ask that you keep them in your thoughts and prayers," said Interim Phoenix Police Chief Sullivan.

Officer Coolidge was with Officer Matthew Haney when they responded to a call on September 3, of a man trying to break into a vehicle. When they approached the man, he ran off, firing at the officers, hitting them both. The officers were rushed to the hospital, while others responded and took the suspect into custody. Sullivan added, "The injuries he sustained after the cowardly acts of another were too much for him to overcome. His legacy will forever be a part of the Phoenix Police Department."





Officer Coolidge served five years with the Phoenix Police Department. He was a certified Field Training Officer in the Mountain View Precinct, training those who have just graduated the academy.

UPDATE ON OFC. HANEY

Officer Matthew Haney, who was also shot that night continues to recover at home. A bullet remains lodged in his chest, but he is expected to make a full recovery. Officer Haney has two-years on the Phoenix Police Department.

He was a lateral hire after spending seven years as an officer with a police department in northern California. Officer Haney is also a Field Training Officer in the Mountain View Precinct.



Duties for a Sign Specialist II include using specialized computers, scanners, software, plotters, silk screening equipment, engravers, and other processes to create standard or customized signs. Types of signs produced include traffic signs and other exterior signs, directional signs, ADA and life safety signs, and banners. This position will often work independently and exercise discretion and judgment for such tasks as editing graphics, mixing paint or inks, designing signs, fabricating signs, installing signs, and maximizing the capabilities of the sign-making computers, software, and other equipment.
