
Only employees who are currently enrolled in a city medical plan can participate in this Scavenger Hunt.



Caseworker I—Head Start Birth to Five Program—
Human Services Department
Pay Range: \$18.60 to \$36.84 per hour
Hiring Range: \$18.60 to \$30.31 per hour

Pay range is the entire compensation range for the position classification. Hiring range is an estimate of where you can receive an offer.

The Head Start Caseworker I position provides case management and social services to families participating in the Head Start Birth to Five program. Duties include:

- Conducting intake meetings, assessing client needs, developing goal plans, providing education, and advocating for clients.
- Good communication and assessment skills, the need to network with community agencies and medical offices, and documentation of case notes in an electronic database.
- ♦ Assigned a caseload of 40-50 families.
- Daily interviews with clients to identify problems, determine assistance needed, refer to appropriate agencies, and perform follow-up contacts

This position will assist with marketing, recruiting eligible families, and attending community events.
