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Real Estate Overview

Tailwinds

- In our view, the industrial sector fundamentals remain strong, stemming from a secular trend towards increasing e-commerce, supply chain reconfiguration and “near-shoring” impacts, though increased new deliveries has resulted in recent upticks in vacancy, particularly for mid-size and big-box distribution warehouses.
- We observed that overall operational performance of market-rate residential rental assets remains steady in many markets, buoyed by higher mortgage rates. While increased new deliveries in select markets such as Phoenix, Atlanta, and Austin, is putting short-term pressure on rents and concessions, medium-term dynamics should remain healthy as new construction starts have declined meaningfully in recent quarters.
- Hotel and retail operating fundamental remain quite healthy, buoyed by resilient consumer spending. Specifically, neighborhood and community centers in regions benefitting from demographic tailwinds, are outperforming.

Headwinds

- The historically-sharp increase in base rates has resulted in steadily declining real estate values since late 2022. At the December 2024 FOMC meeting, the Fed lowered interest rates by 25 bps, resulting in improved sentiment around a potential bottoming in real estate values and capital markets stabilization.
- From market observations we concluded that:
- Increases in interest have resulted in higher cost of debt for many real estate owners, leading to higher yield-requirements (cap rates) for investors as well as non-accretive (negative) leverage at deal origination. Distressed properties will continue to come to market as lenders are less inclined to “amend and extend” in 2025.
 - Debt availability for new acquisitions is limited as many traditional lenders pull back due to DSCR / debt yield thresholds, however traditional lenders have become more inclined to lend to high quality sponsors with proven strategies in fundamentally sound sectors.
 - New potential government policies regarding immigration reform and international trade may result in increasing inflationary pressures.

Performance at a Glance

- The NCREIF Open End Diversified Core (“ODCE”) and NCREIF Property Index (“NPI”) reported Q3 2024 gross returns of 0.3% and 0.8%, respectively.^{1,2}
- Transaction volumes during Q3 2024 were up quarter-over-quarter. The NPI reported 175 property transactions during the quarter, a 22% increase from Q2 2024 (143). Industrial was again the most active sector with a total of 52 transactions, which represented 33% of Q3 deal volume. Apartment properties followed with a total of 52 transactions during the quarter. Q3 transactions in the office and retail sectors totaled 32 and 34, respectively.²
- Apartment, hotel, retail and industrial properties produced positive returns during the quarter according to NPI, with Office as the only negative sector. Office continued to be the lowest performance property sector, the result of continued headwinds in both operating fundamentals and capital markets.²
- The ODCE index reported the fifth consecutive quarter of negative appreciation during Q3 2024 (-0.8%), with a consistently-positive income return of 1.0%. The overall appreciation return for the trailing 1-year is -11.9%.¹

Figure 1: Gross Quarterly Returns | %

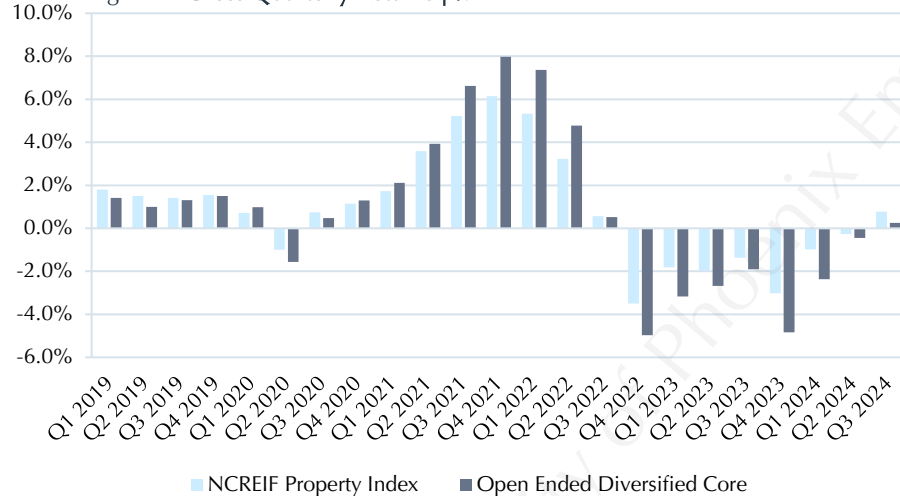
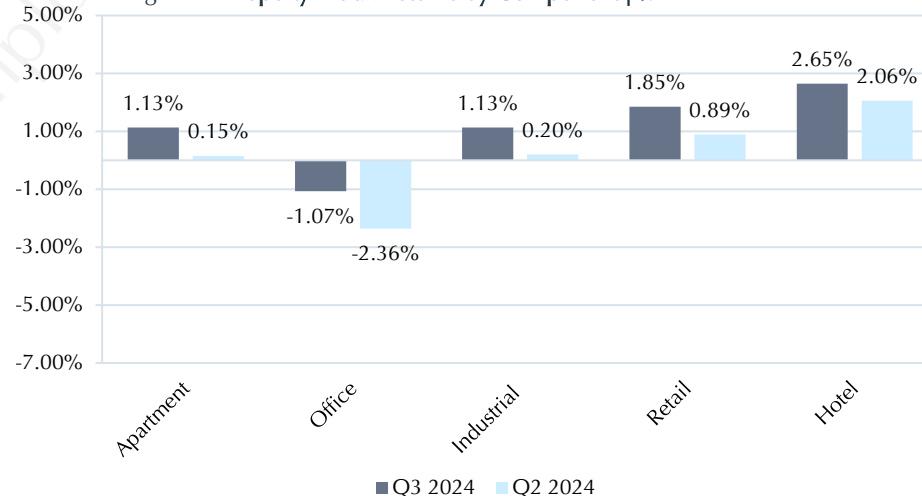
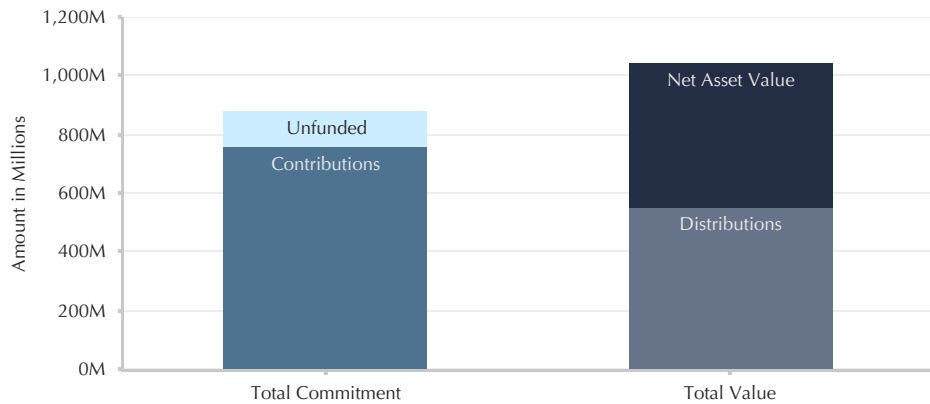


Figure 2: Property Index Returns by Component | %

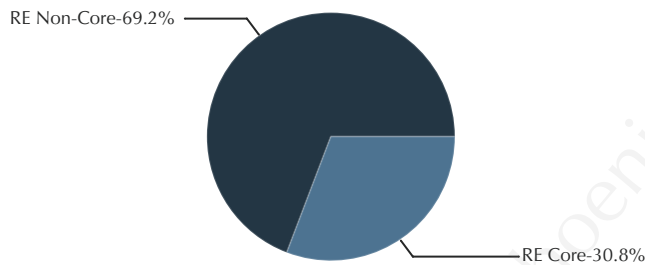

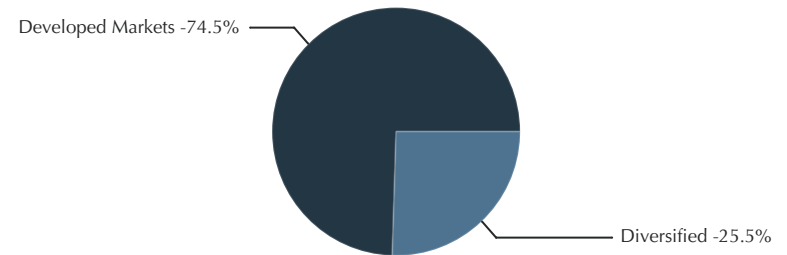

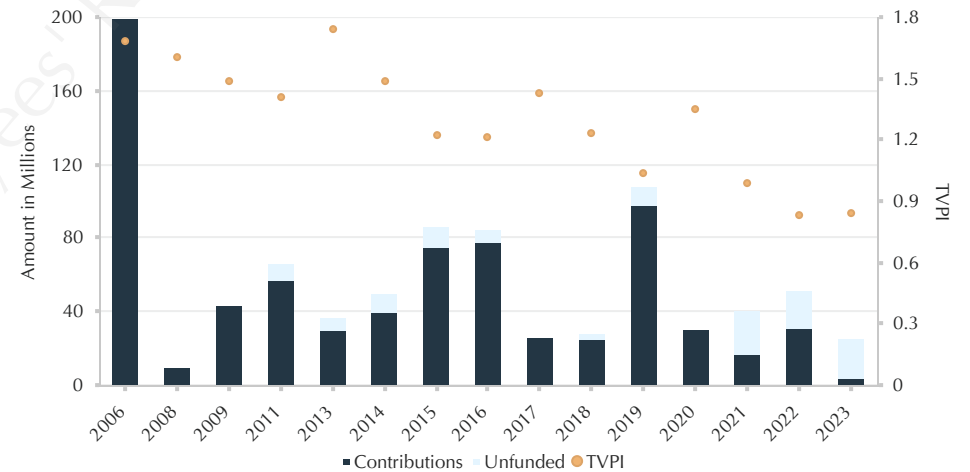

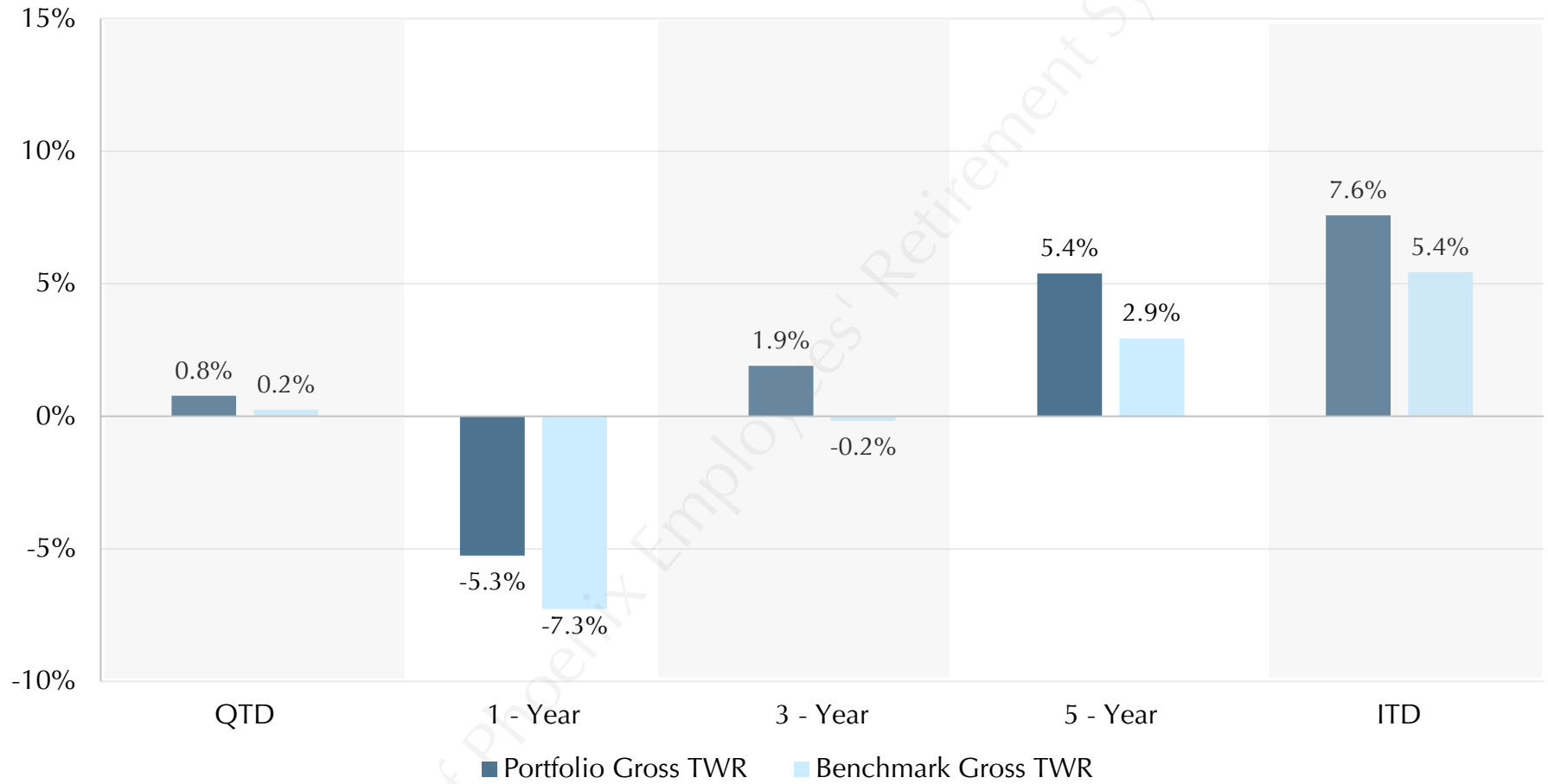

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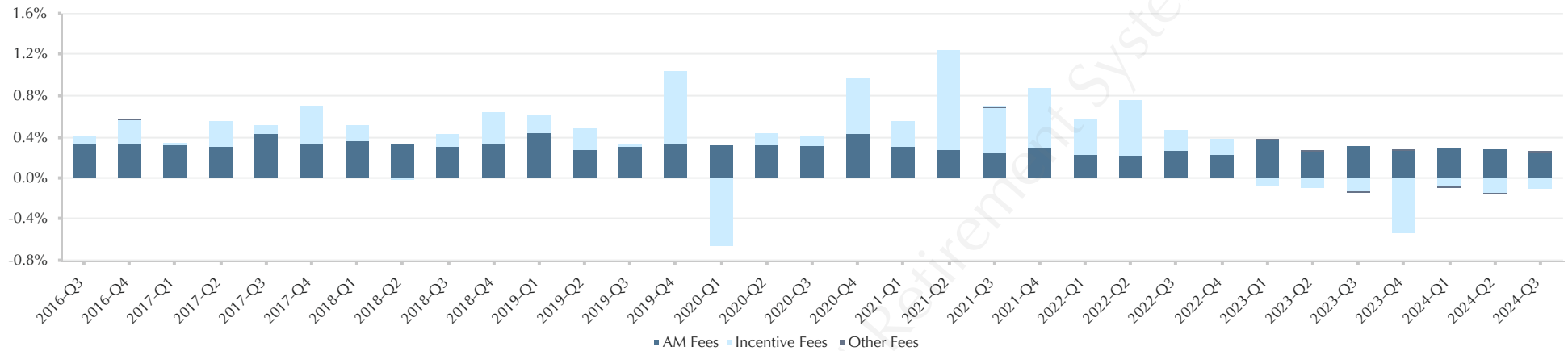


Portfolio Is Well-Diversified by Geography and Property Type

- Unfunded commitments to funds with a U.S. focus (Hammes IV, Focus SH II, Ascentris VA III, Wheelock VI and Adler V) will maintain the portfolio’s domestic concentration.
- The portfolio remains well diversified by property sector, with increasing concentration in emerging demographic-driven sectors such as seniors housing (Focus) and medical office (Hammes), as well as infill industrial (Adler)

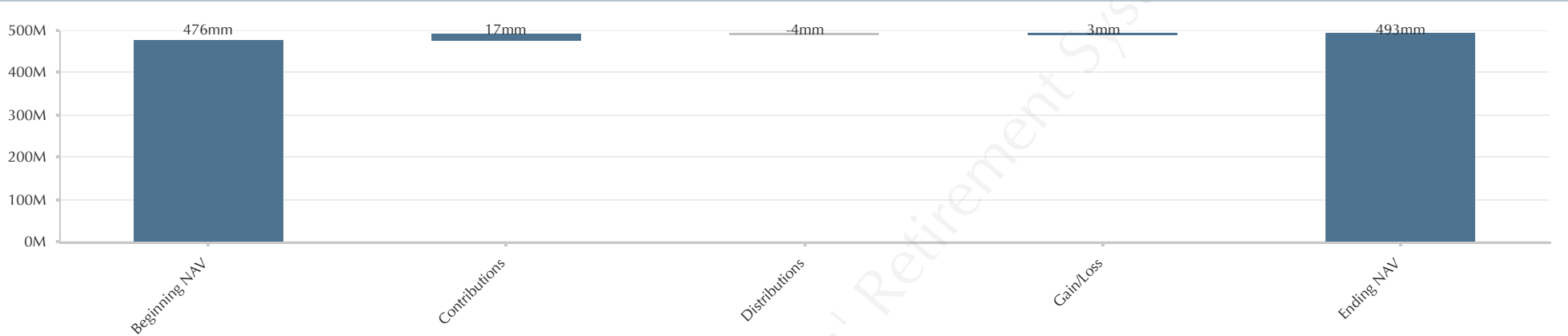




RE Portfolio Fees (% of Market Value)

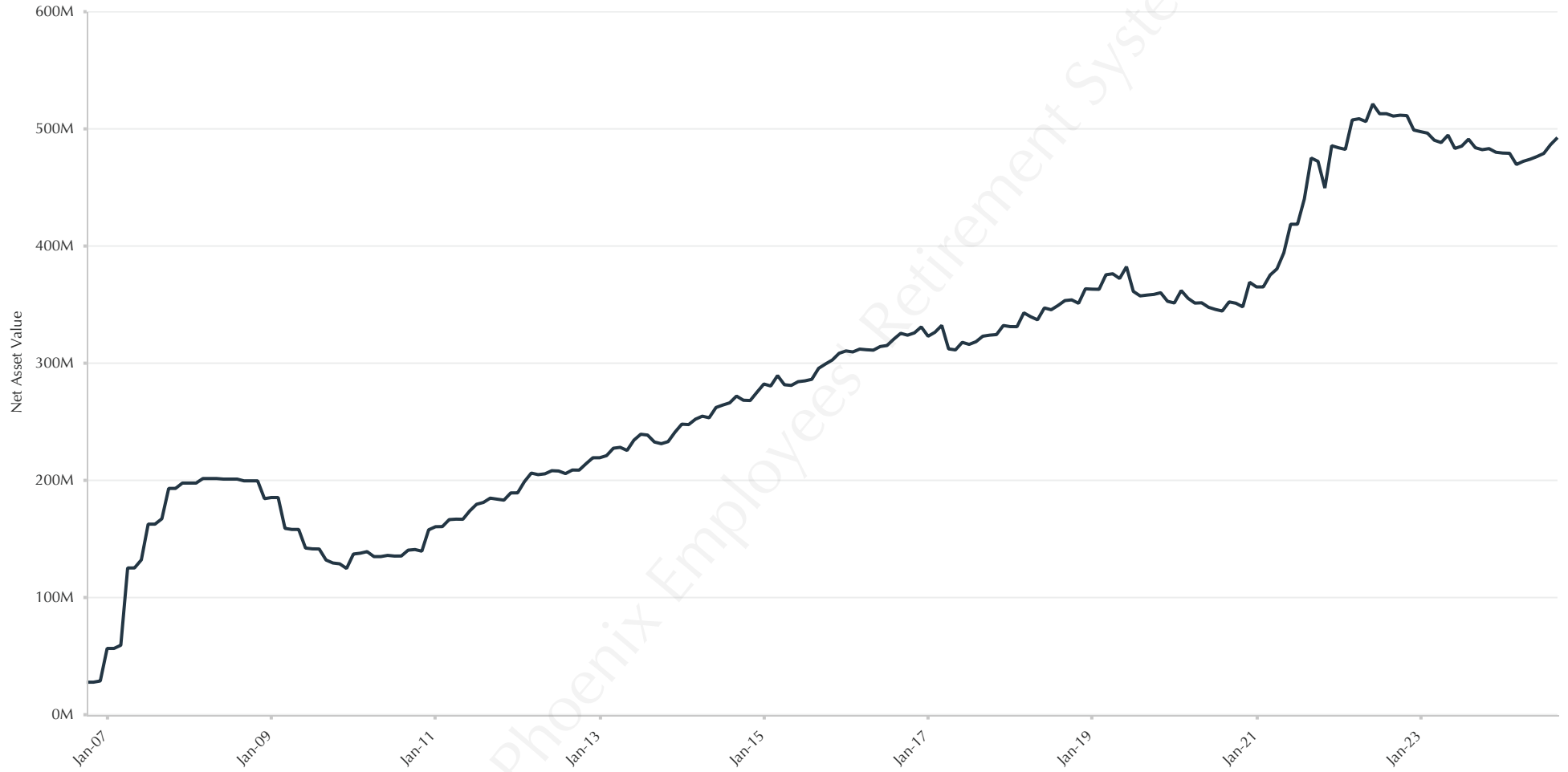

Quarterly Valuation Bridge (Jul-2024 to Sep-2024)

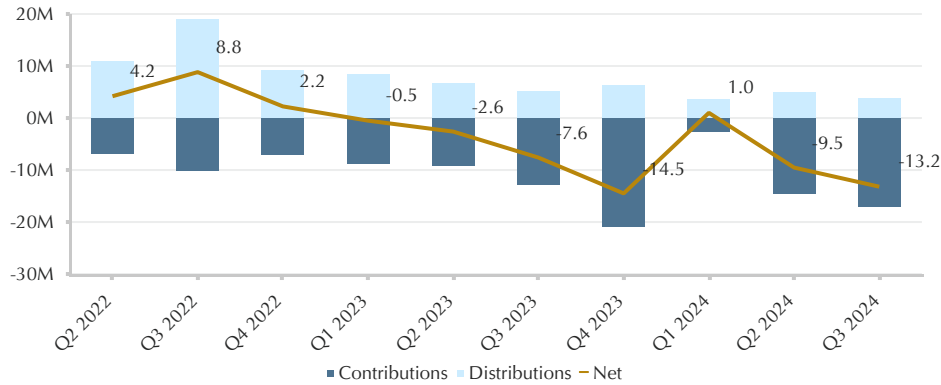


YTD Valuation Bridge (Jan-2024 to Sep-2024)

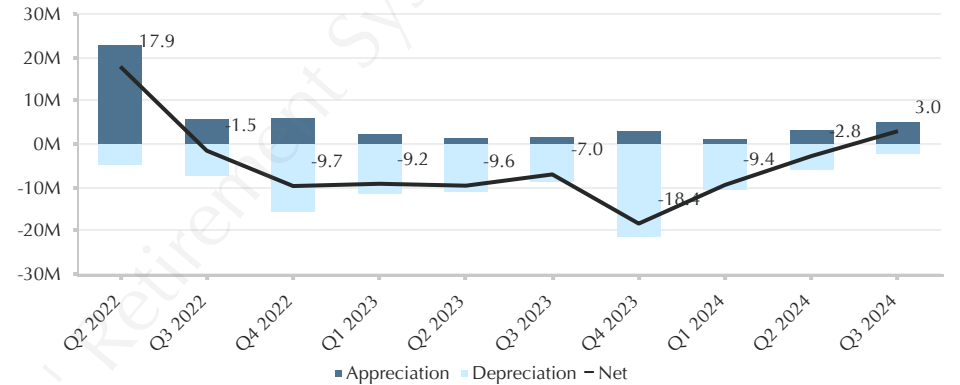




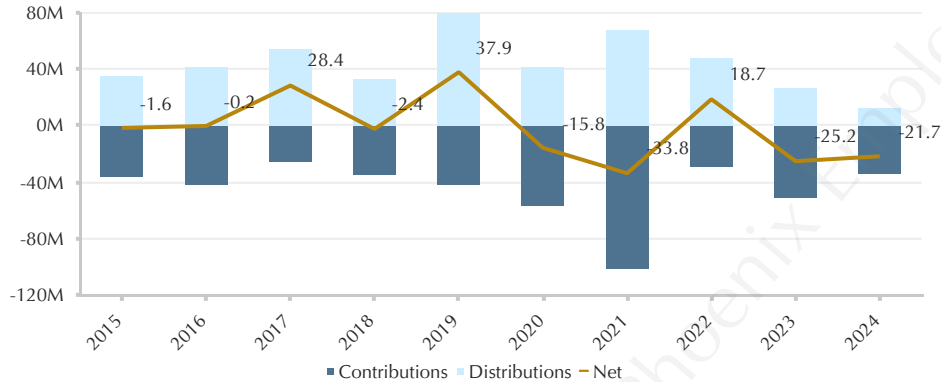
Cash Flows Quarterly



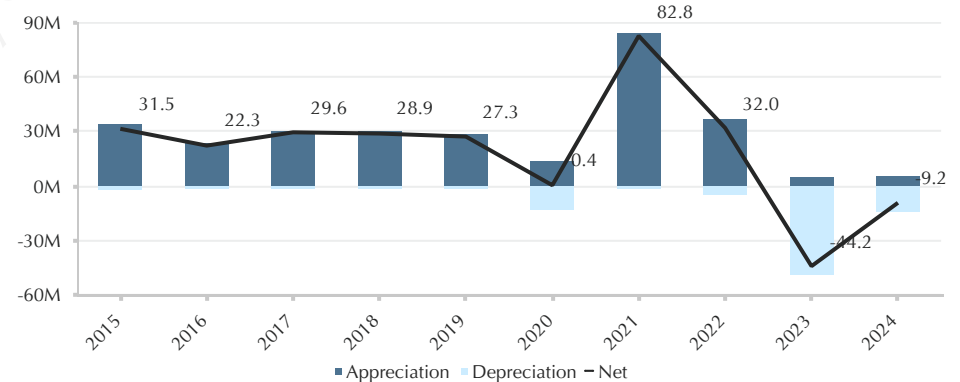
Appreciation/Depreciation Quarterly

4Q2024 Core Portfolio Flash Returns (gross):

- *NCREIF-ODCE Benchmark: +1.2%*
- JP Morgan SPF: +0.9%
- Morgan Stanley Prime: +0.7%
- Realterm Logistics Income Fund: +1.2%

American Landmark Fund III

- In November, the fund made a return of capital distribution of approximately \$0.8 million to COPERS.

Focus Senior Housing Fund II

- In November, the fund called approximately \$2.2 million from COPERS to repay the fund's credit line, primarily used to acquire an existing IL / AL / MC property located in Olympia, WA.

JPMorgan Strategic Property Fund

- In October, the fund made a redemption payment of over \$2.8 million and an income distribution of approximately \$0.7 million.

Morgan Stanley Prime Property Fund

- In December, the fund made an income distribution of approximately \$0.8 million to COPERS.

Wheelock Street Real Estate Fund VII

- In November, the fund called approximately \$0.6 million from COPERS to fund various investments including an adaptive re-use retail asset located in Palm Beach, FL.
