Phoenix Public Pools Open May 29

If you're looking to swim, exercise or just keep cool this summer, the City of Phoenix has 29 pools open to the public during the summer months.

The pools are open six days a week from June 1 to July 28 (closed Fridays). From August through Labor

Day (Sept. 2), 11 pools (Cortez, El Prado, Encanto, Falcon, Hermoso, Maryvale, Paradise Valley, Pecos, Perry, Sunnyslope and Washington) will be open only on weekends.

Splashpads are another option for the kids to cool down now through October 1. Phoenix splashpads are located in Altadena, Civic Space, Dust Devil, Edison, Francisco Highland, Mountain Vista, Nuestro, Pecos and Trailside Point parks.

The Phoenix Parks and Recreation Department partners with various organizations to provide safe and healthy alternatives to youth age 17 and younger. The Kool Kids program provides **FREE** open swim admission to youth at select city of Phoenix pools.

Registration for 2019 swimming lessons and aquatics programs is open. Visit phoenix.gov/parks/pools for more info.

June 1 - Phoenix Public Library Summer Reading Kicks Off

Sign Up, Read, & Win Prizes

Phoenix Public Library will kick off the Summer Reading program starting June 1 and running until August 1. Summer is a time for students to keep up and strengthen their reading skills before the next school year and for readers of all ages to read to improve skills or just for fun!

This year's theme is "A Universe of Stories", aligning with this summer's 50th anniversary of the moon landing.

How do I sign up?

How does it work?

There's something for everyone in our summer reading program—you can earn points, unlock badges, and win prizes. Get one point for every minute you add to your reading log.

Kids 11 and under can earn a free personal pan pizza from Peter Piper Pizza (while supplies last), and participants 12 and older will earn a free chips and guacamole from Rubio's when they reach 500 points. At 1,000 points, participants earn a free book of their choosing!

Grasshopper Bridge Maintenance Work Begins June 3

The Grasshopper Bridge located on 7th Ave./Coral Gables at the Cave Creek Wash in Moon Valley Park will be getting a paint refresh beginning June 3.

The Phoenix Office of Arts and Culture, with help from the Street Transportation Department, will be re-painting the Grasshopper Bridge (built in 1997). Maintenance work will also include sprucing up the landscape around the bridge.



Work hours will be from 5 a.m. – 1 p.m., and the work is expected to take several weeks to complete. During this time, the pedestrian overpass will be closed, but pedestrians can use the sidewalk to the west of the bridge along 7th Ave.



New Black Bins

The city of Phoenix is beginning to roll out new trash containers. As container bins break or reach the end of their lifecycle, the city will replace your old green trash container with a new black container.

The color change is happening for several reasons: Black is more commonly used in the industry for trash collection, the black bins are cost-effective, and they are easier to recycle when no longer in use. Please know that the bins will only be replaced when needed, so we appreciate your patience.
