of the Community Assistance Program (CAP). The CAP, approved by Mayor and Council last year, sets aside \$15 million dollars for the first-of-its kind program to improve the crisis response for behavioral and mental health calls in the community.

### FY 2022-23 Virtual Budget Hearings

City will Host 11 Hearings; District 3 Budget Hearing Scheduled for April 7 at 8:30 a.m.

Every year, the City of Phoenix undergoes a budget process to allocate the City's budget toward the city services, functions, and departments that keep our city running. This includes our Police, Fire, Parks, Streets, Libraries, Senior Centers, PHX CARES and so much more. The Phoenix City Charter requires a balanced budget each year.

In April, the City of Phoenix will host 11 Virtual Community Budget Hearings to gather feedback on the proposed FY22-23 Trial Budget. Community feedback is a vital part of the budget process and will be considered in the development of the City Manager's budget. We want to



hear from you! What are the services and functions that you enjoy, that are vital, and you want to keep? What are areas that need increased funding? What are new programs and services the City should consider? Now is the time to advocate for those needs. The time limit for residents to speak is 2 minutes (4 minutes if Spanish translation is needed).

The District 3 Virtual Budget Hearing will be Thursday, April 7 at 8:30 a.m. via Webex. Please know that while each councilmember was able to select a district-specific date, residents are encouraged to attend any meetings they would like.

The proposed trial budget for FY 2022-23 is projecting a General Fund surplus of \$76 million and includes proposed funds for the following focus areas: affordable housing (\$1.5 million), climate and sustainability (\$1.3 million), economic development, planning and innovation (\$1.6 million), historic preservation and arts (\$0.3 million), homelessness, immigrant/refugee support and fast track cities (\$3.0 million), parks and recreation and library (\$2.7 million), public safety and criminal justice (\$6.3 million), and roadway safety (\$0.6 million). ### What is the General Fund?

The General Fund is part of the City of Phoenix's total budget. The General Fund is made up of resources including general sales tax, property taxes, revenue distributed by the state from income tax, sales and vehicle taxes, and some fines and fees. The General Fund supports many of the services our residents, visitors, and businesses have come to expect in Phoenix such as libraries, parks, senior and youth programs and police and fire services.

After community review, City Manager Barton will present a revised proposed budget to the Phoenix City Council on May 3, 2022. The City Council is expected to decide on the budget on May 17, 2022. The approved budget will take effect July 1, 2022.

Residents are encouraged to participate in upcoming virtual budget hearings. The community is also encouraged to use the City's FundPHX interactive tool to provide input. The FundPHX tool allows residents to provide direct feedback on the proposed FY 2022-23 Trial Budget additions and submit it to the Budget and Research Department. All input received from the tool, at the budget hearings, or by contacting the Budget and Research Department directly at

<u>budget.research@phoenix.gov</u> or by calling 602 262-4800 will be provided to the City Council, so they may consider your feedback prior to adopting the budget.

## Lifeguard Certification Classes & \$2,500 Hiring Incentive

The Phoenix Parks and Recreation Department is offering **\$2,500** in incentive pay for certified lifeguards. The City of Phoenix Parks and Recreation Department needs to hire hundreds of lifeguards ahead of the 2022 pool season to safely open as many of the city's 29 public pools as possible.

Eligible certified lifeguards will receive \$500 on the first paycheck, and the remaining \$2,000 as a one-time payment at the end of the 2022 pool season. The department will pay \$100 to existing employees who refer a person who completes

their lifeguard certification and signs up for employment. To receive the pay, a person must become certified as a lifeguard, work the entire summer and finish in good standing.

The \$2,500 incentive pay reimburses individuals for the cost and time spent obtaining the lifeguard certification. When combined with the base hourly rate of \$14.02/hour, the pay equates to an estimated hourly wage of \$21.00/hour.

StarGuard Training for lifeguard certification is required to become a lifeguard with the City of Phoenix. Those interested in becoming a lifeguard should register for April certification classes right away. Classes are \$20. Applicants must be at least 15-years-old.

The City of Phoenix's partnership with the <u>Arizona Coalition</u> to <u>End Sexual and Domestic Violence</u> and the <u>Sexual</u> <u>Assault Kit Initiative</u> administered by the Bureau of Justice

Assistance seeks to raise public awareness about sexual violence and to educate communities on how to prevent it.

According to the <u>Arizona Coalition to End Sexual and Domestic Violence</u>, "Sexual violence occurs whenever a person is forced, coerced, and/or manipulated into any

unwanted sexual activity, including when s/he is unable to consent due to age, illness, disability, or the influence of alcohol or others drugs."

## **District 3 Street Transportation Department Updates**

This report from the Street Transportation Department covers the period from January 28 through February 24 in District 3.

### **Roadway Repair Work**

Street maintenance crews completed significant roadway repairs near 54<sup>th</sup> St. and E. Charter Oak Rd.

### **Drainage Construction**

As part of routine maintenance, crews inspect for obstructions, clear vegetation, and make repairs to keep flow lines open. Crews performed maintenance, construction, or repair work at 10th Pl. and Thunderbird Rd. and 10th St. and Acoma Dr.

### **Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Alley Dust Proofing**

This project will provide dust proofing measures to 26 miles of alleys from Peoria Ave. to Deer Valley Rd. and 39th Ave. to 44th St. The work will include spraying pre-herbicide, grubbing, grading, installing binder and pre-coated aggregates, adjusting existing sanitary sewer manholes and minor drainage improvements. The project is anticipated to be completed by the end of March.



### Paving Season Resumes - Please be Careful in Work Zones!

Paving season began in early March. It will be another busy season with crews working citywide to rehabilitate our streets and provide drivers a smooth path around the city. Please be extra cautious in work zones so everyone can safely return to their families each night.
