1,000 Alley Gate and Birthday Celebration



On Saturday, March 22nd, we celebrated a major milestone for our district and city! We have successfully installed 1,000 alley gates, enhancing safety and security for our residents. This achievement is a testament to our commitment to creating safer, cleaner neighborhoods for everyone thanks to the resident leaders, supportive property owners, and the Neighborhood Services Department. The Gated Alley Program started five years ago, including two successful pilot years, and it's delivering real results for our communities.


The City has invested approximately **\$5.5 million** in this program, leading to the installation of **1,000 gates in about 434 alleys citywide**, helping protect families and properties. One third of all the gated alleys are in District 5, and we're not stopping there — 30 more alleys in District 5 are set to be gated by the end of this year, ensuring even more neighbors experience these safety benefits. And to top it off, we celebrated my birthday! Grand Canalscape Grand Opening this Sat.



We're excited to invite you to the long-awaited Grand Canalscape Phase 3 Ribbon Cutting this Saturday, March 29th from 10 a.m. to Noon. This will be a big free event that will activate public spaces for cyclists and pedestrians, with improved lighting, exercise equipment, and a new pedestrian bridge.

In addition, there will be new signalized pedestrian crossings at major intersections to make the streets safer. This phase adds four more miles of improvements to the previous 12 miles completed back in 2020.



The celebration will be centered at **Sunset Basin Park on 63rd Ave. just south of Indian School Rd.** There will be music, free games, fun, refreshments, food truck, and information tables between 67th and 59th avenues. The ceremonial walk will be at 10 a.m. from Maryvale High School to the new pedestrian bridge for the ribboncutting. There is still time to take the Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) survey! Please make sure your voice is included – now is the time to provide input on how BRT is implemented along **35th Ave. from Peoria Ave. to Van Buren St.** 

There are two options, one with dedicated bus lanes in the curb lane (siderunning) and one with dedicated bus lanes in the center of the road (center-running). ## **Community Budget Hearings in District 5**



- Send feedback via email, phone, or social media



Phoenix Public Library locations, except South Mountain Community Library, are closed on Monday, March 31 in observance of the holiday.
