

Phoenix Mayor Kate Gallego and I joined the Estrella Supermoms Block Watch members and staff from the Street Transportation Department to commemorate the activation of the city's 75th pedestrian signal crossing on Thursday, March 24th. The newest signal is located at Indian School Road and Amelia Avenue (between 83rd and 81st avenues).

Formally referred to as a HAWK (**H**igh-Intensity **A**ctivated cross**W**al**K**), the signal features pedestrian triggered flashing red-yellow-red beacons and provides a safe crossing point for pedestrians near busy intersections and mid-block locations. A HAWK operates similar to a standard traffic signal, minus a green-signal light, and remains "dark" until engaged by a pedestrian.

In addition, on Tuesday, March 22nd, we celebrated the installation of five new speed cushions in the Tomahawk Elementary School neighborhood. Residents Marcela and Jorge, with support from the Tomahawk Village Block Watch took the leadership to contact our office and work together with us to collect the needed signatures and find the funding for these speed cushions.

During the last several years, there has been a dramatic increase in traffic collisions and incidents involving pedestrians in Maryvale. The additions of the signal and speed cushions are important steps to reverse that trend. Residents will feel safer when they walk, bike or access public transit along these streets.

The City of Phoenix has allocated funds from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) to help micro and small businesses affected by the pandemic's economic impact.

Eligible micro and small business in Phoenix may receive up to \$15,000. The grants funds may be used for any business expense that is categorized by the Internal Revenue Service as a "deductible expense." In the past, grant recipients have used these funds to pay for rent/mortgage, payroll, insurance, inventory, and utilities among other expenses.

Applications will be accepted until April 15, 2022, unless all grant funds are awarded prior to this deadline.
