# **GO Bond Election Voting Ends Nov. 7th**



GO Bond programs help to fund infrastructure needs of City facilities such as parks, libraries, fire and police stations, affordable housing, streets and storm drains. Registered resident voters will vote whether to approve or reject the 2023 GO Bond Program during a special mail only election ending on Tuesday, November 7, 2023.

Phoenix City Council approved the following allocations per program area totaling **\$500 million**:

- Arts & Culture \$50,385,000
- Economic Development & Education \$38,000,000
- Environment & Sustainability \$26,000,000
- Housing, Human Services & Homelessness \$63,000,000

- Neighborhoods & City Services \$44,615,000
- Parks & Recreation \$64,000,000
- Public Safety \$132,500,000
- Streets & Storm Drainage \$81,500,000

These allocations include many District 5 projects such as:

- Yucca Branch Library expansion \$10.6 million
- Fire Station 15 & Community Assistance Program \$21.4 million
- Maryvale Police Precinct renovation \$3 million
- New Latino Cultural Center \$21.7 million
- Maryvale Park Regional Pool and Two Splash Pad Sites \$21.4 million

## **Grand-35 Study for Street Improvements**




The Arizona Department of Transportation, in coordination with the city of Phoenix and Maricopa Association of Governments, is hosting a public hearing Oct. 25 to provide an opportunity for public review and comments on an engineering and environmental study for a proposed intersection improvement project at US 60 (Grand Avenue), 35th Avenue and Indian School Road (known as the Grand-35 Study).

Proposed improvements include raising 35th Avenue above Grand Avenue to create an elevated intersection, improving traffic operations, enhancing safety, improving pedestrian and bicycle facilities and reducing vehicle/train conflicts.
