Morning Circle Time: Morning Circle Time. Let's get ready for school by having a morning circle time. We will talk about the days of the week, the events coming up, ask fun, engaging questions and share new things with each other. After circle time we will all go to storytime. **Ages Birth to 5**

Family Storytime: Storytime is a program designed for children aged 0-5 and their parents. It introduces your child to books, rhymes, rhythm, music, fingerplays, games and taking turns playing attending and being in a group. **Ages Birth to 5**

Baby Storytime: Baby story time is a program designed for children ages 0-2 and their parents. It involves reading short, colorful books with engaging images and interactive elements like textures or sounds. The goal is to introduce babies to the rhythm of language and the joy of books through simple stories, nursery rhymes, fingerplays, and songs. **Ages Birth to 24 months**

Bilingual Storytime: Bilingual story times are a great way to create a welcoming space for new families and strengthen a child's early literacy skills. It allows families to see themselves and their culture through books, rhymes and movement. It is also an opportunity to nurture cognitive and language development for families in their native language as well as a chance for monolingual families to share in the cultural and linguistic diversity. **Ages Birth to 5**
