A Community Inspired by the Richness of Its Diversity

The Phoenix Human Relations Commission is a 17-member advisory board appointed by the mayor and City Council. It advises the City Council on human relations issues and assists in implementing the city's policy against discrimination. The commission operates or supports programs designed to promote positive intergroup relations.

Membership

Members serve three-year terms. These terms are staggered, allowing a turnover of one-third of the seats on an annual basis.

Programs and Events

Martin Luther King Jr. (MLK) Awards Program

The program honors individuals who have made our city a better place through their dedication to human and civil rights. Commissioners and volunteers select the winners of the annual Calvin C. Goode Lifetime Achievement Award and the MLK Living the Dream Award. They also coordinate with the Arizona Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Celebration Committee on the annual MLK Awards Breakfast.

Faces of Diversity Brown Bag Series

The series features dynamic people telling their stories of diversity in our community – stories on race, ethnicity, gender issues, disability awareness, religion and more. Presenters range from community activists, civil rights experts and human services professionals to artists, authors and poets.
