DROWNINGS ARE PREVENTABLE

Drowning is a tragedy that can happen to anyone. Unfortunately, it happens quickly, it is often silent and unexpected.

- Drowning is the single leading cause of death for children ages 1-4.
- Drowning is the second leading cause of death for children up to 14 years of age.
- There is an average of 4,012 drowning deaths per year.
- Drowning remains among the top four causes of death from age 54 and up.
- The U.S. experiences an average of 11 fatal drownings per day and an average of 22 non-fatal drownings per day.
- Nearly 40% of drownings treated in emergency departments require hospitalization or further care for conditions including brain damage and long-term disability.
- Drowning costs the U.S. Economy an estimated \$53.22 billion annually.
- A person can drown in as little as 20-60 seconds.
- Above the age of 1, nearly 80% of drowning deaths involve males due to increased exposure to water and risk-taking behaviors.
- 88% of child drownings occur with at least 1 adult present.
- 23% of child drownings happen during a family gathering near a pool.
- We lose 11 school buses worth of children to fatal unintentional drowning per year, with the average school bus seating 80 students.
- Almost 70% of drownings of young children occur when they are not swimming.
