#### Phoenix Summer Safety Operation Totals 5/1/25 – 6/18/25:

- 372 heat related calls for service (Source: Phoenix FD). •
- 5,700 visits in respite and extended hour cooling centers • (based on intake forms received).
- Overall, noon to 1pm and between the hours of 4 and 8 pm • have seen the highest number of people arriving.
- Walk/Bike (64%) is the most popular method of getting to • the cooling center.
- 4,420 visits (83%) indicated they are experiencing homelessness.
- 954 visitors have requested onsite assistance from CBI with • various shelter or homeless solution referrals. 19 visitors required additional follow up for their referral, which was submitted by the Office of Emergency Management on their behalf.
- ASU nursing students engaged with 43 patients this heat relief year-to-date, for wound care and blood pressure and glucose checks. The students had additional engagement with visitors by presenting health education topics, they also packed Naloxone kits and spent time in the children's area.

#### **Unsheltered Visits**

Between 6/12 – 6/18, 878 visits (87%) indicated they were unsheltered.

#### Referrals

192 referrals were requesting shelter or other homeless solution services. There were 4 additional referrals that required follow up from the Office of Emergency Management.

#### **ASU Medicals Students**

The ASU nursing students engaged with 14 clients for wound care and blood pressure and glucose checks. They also assisted with packing Naloxone kits and did some education with the children.

**Patients Transported** 

The average high for the seventh week of the heat relief operation was 111 degrees (compared to 109 degrees the same time last year). There was an excessive heat warning from 6/14 - 6/20, which encompasses most of the reporting period for this heat recap.

There were 124 heat related calls for service the seventh week of the heat relief operation, 6/12-6/18 compared to 39 calls for service last year.
