Know the name of the park/and or trail you will be hiking on. Having a trail map is recommended. Know where you are going and know what kind of terrain you will be hiking on. It is important to remember that the Phoenix mountain preserves are open, undeveloped desert areas. Hikers can encounter rock terrain, rattlesnakes and other potential hazards native to the Sonoran Desert. Dreamy Draw Bring plenty of water (one quart for short hikes-more for longer hikes).
