BACKGROUND

Pursuant to Section 48-716, Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended, the District Treasurer of the Park Central Community Facilities District, (the "District") has caused to be prepared for the Board of Directors of the District (the "District Board") a proposed budget for the fiscal year 2019-20 (the "District Budget") and has caused the proposed District Budget to be submitted to the District Board for approval by adoption of a resolution. Pursuant to Section 3.11(b) of the District Development, Financing Participation, Waiver and Intergovernmental Agreement executed in connection with the formation and activities of the District, the District Treasurer has also caused to be prepared for, and submitted to, the District Board a proposed five-year financial plan for the District (the "Five-Year Forecast").

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF PARK CENTRAL COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT APPROVING THE PROPOSED BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2019-20 AND A PROPOSED FIVE-YEAR FINANCIAL PLAN AND CALLING A HEARING ON SUCH BUDGET AND FINANCIAL PLAN AS APPROVED

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PARK CENTRAL COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT as follows:

1. Findings.

A hearing on the proposed District Budget and the proposed Five-Year Forecast is hereby ordered as required by law, and the District Manager is hereby instructed to establish the date and provide all notices of such hearing as required by law.

3. Effective Date.

This resolution shall be effective immediately.
