**UPDATE: March 14, 2025** 

The initial scene investigation regarding this collision is complete and the area is open for normal traffic. The preliminary investigation indicates that only two vehicles were involved in the collision, one of which was the marked Phoenix Police Tahoe. The Tahoe was westbound Buckeye Road when the other vehicle involved turned left, from eastbound on Buckeye Road, in front of the officer at which time the collision occurred. The Tahoe rolled over as a result of this collision.

The officer remains in the hospital, as does one of the other adults transported as a result of the collision. Both are considered to be in stable condition. Impairment was determined to not be a factor in this collision. Additional details related to this collision remain part of the ongoing investigation.

## Collision Results in Several Serious Injuries, Including Officer

(March 14, 2025) Phoenix Police detectives are investigating an overnight collision that hospitalized multiple people, to include a Phoenix Police Officer.

On March 14, 2025, around 12:45 a.m., an officer was in the area of the Black Canyon Access Road and Buckeye Road when they were involved in a collision resulting in the Phoenix Police Tahoe rolling over. Two additional vehicles were involved in the collision with the officer. Other officers and fire personnel arrived on scene and located all of those with injuries. The officer was transported to a nearby hospital with serious but non-life-threatening injuries and he is currently in stable condition. Two other adult occupants of the other cars involved in the collision were also transported to a nearby hospital, both with non-life-threatening injuries.

Detectives responded to take over the investigation. It is not yet known if impairment was a factor in this collision. Additional details about the collision remain part of the ongoing investigation.
