Hello Streets Team!





Street Transportation Department was awarded \$1.44 million through the Reconnecting Communities Program (RCP) to advance Phase IV of the Phoenix Grand Canalscape project. This phase will create a 3.25-mile multiuse path along the Grand Canal, from 47th to 23rd Avenues, enhancing connectivity. The project includes a study to address crossing challenges at Interstate 17 and Grand Avenue/US 60 Highway. The primary goal is to provide a safe, accessible route for bicyclists and pedestrians, improving access to essential services and amenities such as employment opportunities, educational institutions, healthcare facilities, food sources, and recreational areas.

The Street Transportation Department and its design consultant presented an update on the Rio Salado Bicycle and Pedestrian Bridge Project to the Central City and South Mountain Village Planning Meetings. The team shared progress on the design, including public art decisions and renderings and discussed how public input was used to guide decisions for both the bridge design and the public art elements. The bridge will be an important component supporting mobility between both Villages and planning areas. The bridge will be centrally located within the city's 20-mile Rio riparian corridor.


