
Memorial Day

Wallace and Ladmo Ceremonial Sign







Mayor Kate Gallego, Councilman Carlos Galindo-Elvira and Wallace and Ladmo cast member Pat McMahon gathered to reveal the "Wallace and Ladmo Way" ceremonial street sign on Wednesday, April 16 at the corner of N. 1st Avenue and McKinley Street.

The ceremonial "Wallace and Ladmo Way" was mounted on the mast arm of the traffic signal pole at the Southwest corner of N. 1st Avenue and McKinley Street, just up the street from the original KPHO studios that was home to the Wallace and Ladmo Show for 35 years.

Mary Rose Wilcox Way Ceremonial Sign

The Honorable Mary Rose Wilcox was recognized with a ceremonial street sign "The Mary Rose Wilcox Way" outside of her family restaurant, El Portal, in South Phoenix.

Mrs. Wilcox made history as the first Hispanic woman to serve on both the Phoenix City Council and the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors. Her commitment to public service paved the way for generations to come.





City of Phoenix Inauguration



The City of Phoenix has established the Heat Illness & Injury Prevention Program to minimize or eliminate employee exposure to heat related hazards. Our department will follow the components of this program from May 1 – September 30, or anytime a heat advisory or heat warning day has been issued by the National Weather Service.

Safety Tips for Heat and Hydration

- Know the signs of Heat Exhaustion and Heat Stroke.
- Drink more water than usual:
 - Avoid sugary drinks, alcohol and caffeine
- Take frequent breaks and wear lightcolored clothing and wide-brimmed hats.
- Look after your fellow employees for signs and symptoms of potential heat injury.
