We were proud to be a part of the special unveiling of the ceremonial street sign for "Avenida Mujeres del Movimiento," ("Women of the Movement Avenue") at 10th Place and Hadley Street with Mayor Kate Gallego, District 8 Councilwoman Kesha Hodge Washington, and District 7 Councilman Carlos Galindo-Elvira.



Located next to Santa Rita Hall, this occasion commemorates the start of the historical Chicano movement that took place beginning in the 1960s where a large group of supporters - mostly women - helped organize rallies, register voters and support Cesar Chavez in his advocacy efforts. Some of the surviving members of this group were in attendance, along with family representatives, who were recognized and presented ceremonial medallions.




