


Employee events are being held at City Hall Atrium on Thursday, May 30 and Friday May 31, both days from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.



BRING YOUR CHILD TO WORK DAY

Bring Your Child to Work Day is taking place on **Wednesday, June 12**! Street Transportation will be offering a tour of the Traffic Management Center on the 6th floor of City Hall from 10 to 11 a.m. and 2 to 3 p.m. Children and their parents will be able to tour the room where our team monitors the city's nearly 1,200 signalized intersections. Employees are invited to participate in this day with the approval of their supervisor. The suggested age range for participation is 6 -18 years old, based on the types of activities being offered.





Summer Safety

The City of Phoenix has established the Heat Illness & Injury Prevention Program to minimize or eliminate employee exposure to heat related hazards that may lead to serious illnesses, injuries, or death. The Street Transportation Safety Team is responsible for the oversight and management of this program, including reviewing/updating this program and submitting to Human Resources Safety for approval. Our department will follow the components of this program from May 1 – September 30, or anytime a heat advisory or heat warning day has been issued by the National Weather Service.

Safety Tips for Heat and Hydration

- Know the signs of Heat Exhaustion and Heat Stroke.
- Drink more water than usual:
 - o Avoid sugary drinks, alcohol and caffeine
- Take frequent breaks and wear light-colored clothing and wide-brimmed hats.
- Look after your fellow employees for signs and symptoms of potential heat injury.
