

largest 3D-printed home community is being developed in Texas, with its first house now complete. This innovative construction method could significantly cut carbon emissions and waste, as 3D printing eliminates the need for traditional concrete molds, reducing overall cement use. Given that cement production accounts for about 8% of global CO2 emissions, this technology offers a promising path toward more sustainable building practices. Stefano Boeri. Boeri believes trees have unique personalities and can communicate. The buildings are self-sustaining, using solar energy and recycled water to nourish the plants, which absorb 44,000 pounds of carbon annually while reducing street noise. Groundbreaking Energy Island Denmark has approved the construction of the world's first energy island, a massive project designed to power three million households. The island, initially the size of 18 football fields, will serve as a hub for 200 offshore wind turbines, with plans to expand

its size. While the exact location remains undisclosed, the island will be situated 80 kilometers into the North Sea. To discover more about this groundbreaking initiative, click here.


